The Year in Faith - It is not an exaggeration to say that if there had not been a Pope John XXIII there would not be a Pope Francis. And it could be added that the papacies of Pope Paul VI and Pope John Paul II would have been vastly different. How different we will never know but one must acknowledge this reality. Throughout the life of this soon to be canonized saint Angelo Roncalli lived out what would be his episcopal motto: "Obedience and Peace". He was born in humble circumstances to devout parents. After years of study he was ordained and assigned as a seminary professor as well as the secretary of the diocesan bishop. He was drafted and served in the medical corps binding up broken bodies and wounded spirits. Rome took note of this ebullient and charitable priest and asked him to take charge of the Society of the Propagation of Faith. He then entered the diplomatic corps as a bishop during the most difficult days of WWII. Through various methodologies he saved thousands of Jews from certain death.

He rejoiced in being able to leave the world of diplomacy and become a pastor again as the Patriarch of Venice. With this position he received the red hat of Cardinal. The most dramatic act of his papacy was to call for an ecumenical council. He specifically called it the Second Vatican Council distancing it from the past council seeking to open the dialogue with the modern world. John XXIII was the first to leave the city state and visit his diocese of Rome especially its prison and hospitals. He refused to eat alone which had been the papal custom.

When we reflect on the life of this "good pope", we see the virtue of obedience fulfilled in a wonderful way. He sought not his own will but the will of God. He tried to bring peace to his Church and the larger world. He watches over the church of today, interceding for her to become the voice of the living God.

Our Journey in Faith -

As winter falls upon us we can expect a mood change as well as a desire to be kept warm and protected from the cold and increasingly dark time of the year. It makes sense that some animals hibernate and birds seek the warmer climate of the south. We all turn inward and for some a melancholia takes over and sadness and depression hold sway.

On this Sunday of the year the scriptures seem to read our minds and speak to our hearts. "May our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who has loved us and gives us everlasting encouragement and good hope through His grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word." (Paul to Thessalonians). There is no reason to hide and turn inward with ourselves for God is at our side encouraging us no matter our situation or circumstance.

The psalmist says: "Wait for the Lord, take courage; be stouthearted, wait for the Lord" (Psalm 27). If we call upon the Lord, He will surely respond. It is up to us to listen and to act upon His word. For the Lord is faithful and He will guard us from the evil one. Winter is a time for us to lean upon the Lord, to experience His love and concern. He is always there for us, if only we open our hearts to receive Him.
